Florida exceptionalism in relationship to the black freedom struggle is placed in its proper regional and national perspective.

Michael Butler is the Kenan Distinguished Professor of History at Flagler College. Dr. Butler co-authored *Victory After the Fall: The Memories of Civil Rights Activist H. K. Matthews*, and has published numerous essays in various academic journals.
