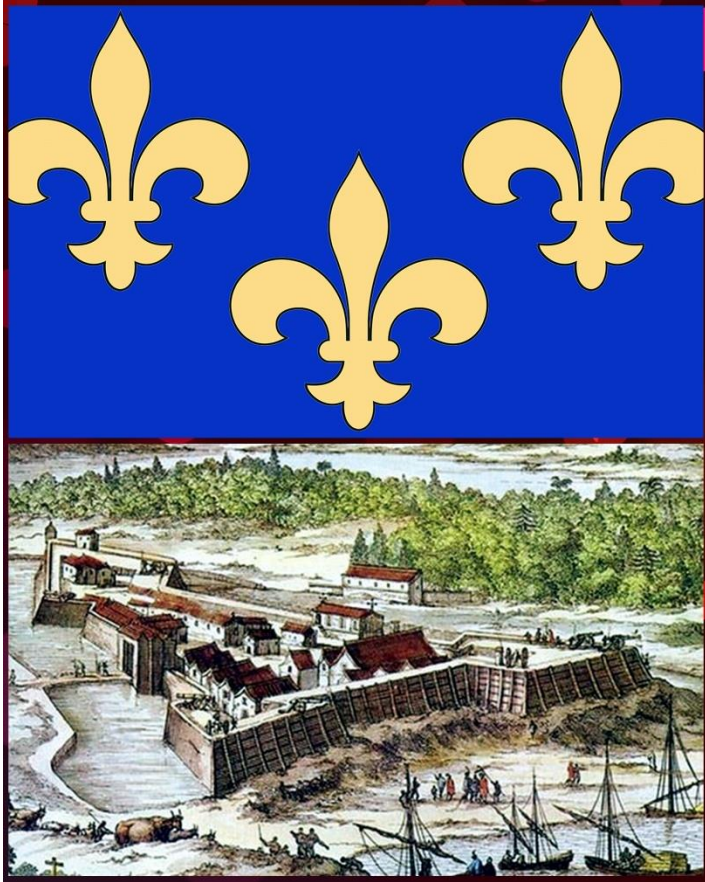

James “Zach” Zacharias will discuss how the French had a long connection to Florida dating back to 1563 with their colony of Fort Caroline.
