Michael Butler, Ph.D. is a Kenan Distinguished Professor of History at Flagler College, where he has taught since August 2008. He received both his Masters and Doctorate in History from the University of Mississippi, where he specialized in 20th century Southern history with an emphasis on the civil rights

movement. Dr. Butler co-authored *Victory After the Fall: The Memories of Civil Rights Activist H. K. Matthews*, and has published numerous essays in various academic journals.
